Every Claim, Source, and Verification Status

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## How to Use This Document

Each entry identifies a specific factual claim made in the video, the source it is based on, where to verify it, and any notes on confidence level. Claims are organized in the order they appear in the video.

### Verification levels:

- PRIMARY — Sourced from official Watchtower publications, the biblical text, Watchtower service year reports, or court/legal records
  - SECONDARY — Sourced from established research sites (JWFacts, Wikipedia), academic researchers, or reputable journalism
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## SECTION 1: The Doctrine and Its History

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### **Claim: 24,576 people partook of the bread and wine at the 2025 Memorial.**

## SECTION 2: The Numbers Problem

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**Claim: At the 1935 Memorial, 52,465 Witnesses partook of the emblems worldwide.**

## SECTION 3: The Biblical Evidence

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**Claim: Sanderson conflates Revelation 5:9-10 (people from 'every tribe and tongue and people and nation') with the 144,000, but that phrase actually describes the great crowd in Revelation 7:9.**

**Claim: The Greek word naos (used in Revelation 7:15 for the location of the great crowd) refers to the inner sanctuary / Holy of Holies, not the outer courtyard. The word hieron (full temple complex) never appears in the book of Revelation.**
